

## **Emergency Shelter (ES) Services**

Hale Kipa operates several types of shelters on O'ahu offering emergency services for youth through age 17. Our shelters are open to youth who have been abused, or are neglected, unsheltered, or facing a personal crisis.

Our **Girls Emergency Shelter** houses eight females at a time, ages 12 through 17.

Our **Boys Emergency Shelter** houses eight males at a time, ages 12 through 17.

**Kamala Homes (KH)** are temporary emergency foster homes on O'ahu that provide services to youth ages 12 through 17 who may best be served in a home setting. Kamala Home parents are licensed and trained by Hale Kipa.

Hale Kipa's **Hale Ho'opakele** on O'ahu is open to youth ages 12 through 17 who are victims/survivors of commercial sexual exploitation and/or sex trafficking.

All of our emergency shelters accept selfreferrals as well as referrals from Child Protective Services, Family Court, parents, and youth agencies.

- Physical and TB clearances

- Participate in supportive services (groups, recreation, etc.)
- Attend an educational program


